STEM 7




STEM refers to Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths - four academic disciplines rapidly changing careers and industries.

STEM skills increase employability - they boost creative thinking, improve technical abilities and help us approach new challenges with confidence.

Apprenticeships



Apprenticeships are work-based training programmes designed around the needs of employers, which lead to nationally recognised qualifications. Whether you are just starting out in your career, or are established in your role, an apprenticeship is an ideal way to develop your existing skills so you can progress further, or retrain in a whole new role.

We offer different types of apprenticeships corresponding to the experience individuals hold:



Intermediate apprenticeships are the first level of apprenticeships. They teach candidates who are new to the industry the basic skills and knowledge required to progress along their chosen career path.

Advanced apprenticeships build on the skills and knowledge acquired from an intermediate apprenticeship. This level is suitable for those who have previously completed an apprenticeship, or have been within their job role for some time.

Higher apprenticeships are for those working within senior roles who want to develop their skills further in order to progress. These apprenticeships are the equivalent to completing a foundation degree or HND. Examples of job roles include apprentice teacher, lab technician or project manager.

Degree apprenticeships or master's degree apprenticeships are for those who want to be a specialist within their field and hold a senior position within a company (such as senior management or technical specialist). These apprenticeships usually involve the undertaking of an undergraduate or postgraduate qualification.

Free Courses for Jobs

Level 3+ courses for 19+ learners

If you don't hold a full Level 3 qualification* (equivalent to 2 A Levels), you can now study certain Level 3 courses for free – thanks to the government's Free Courses for Jobs programme. If you are earning below £25,000 or are unemployed, you may also qualify.

Aged 19-23

You may be eligible for free tuition if you don't have an existing full Level 3 qualification but plan to study a Level 3 course – including CACHE or BTEC courses, and professional qualifications.



This is dependent on the qualifications you previously achieved and the qualification you choose to study. Please get in touch for more information or visit harrogate-college.ac.uk/fees-funding

Aged 24 or over

If you have an existing full Level 3 qualification, you may also be eligible for free tuition on courses funded through the government's Free Courses for Jobs programme. To find out if you are eligible contact us today.

*West Yorkshire residents only; residents of other non-devolved areas who do not hold a Full Level 3 qualification, do not earn below £25,000 and are not unemployed, must be aged 19-23 on 31st August.

Fees and Funding

Course fees vary depending on the course you choose - the cost is stated on each individual listing: please refer to this for details. Some courses, dependent on your circumstances, could be free, or funded by an employer - again please refer to the course listing for details.

For learners aged 19+ many of our courses may be free if any of the following apply:

- You are under 25 and have an Education, Health and Care Plan from your local authority
- > You are wanting to join basic skills English and maths courses (not ESOL)
- > You are wanting to join GCSE English or maths courses and you don't already have a GCSE grade 4 (previous grade C) in that subject, or have been assessed at below grade 4
- You are wanting to join a computing class (EDSQ)
- > You are under 24 and you don't already have a qualification at Level 3 or higher

- You are 24 or older and you don't already have a Full Level 2 qualification or higher (West Yorkshire only)
- > You are unemployed and in receipt of benefits
- > You are working and your annual wage is less than £25,000 gross per year

It depends on the level of the course and your circumstances as to whether you can take the course for free; please ask for further information and what evidence you may need to provide.

In some circumstances, even if you don't meet the criteria, you may be able to get some financial assistance through our Learner Support Funds and Student Life team.

Adults and young people are entitled to free English, maths and digital skills tuition if they do not already have a GCSE grade 4 (previous grade C) or Level 2 qualification in that subject, or their assessment results are at a low level. Adults under 24 studying for their first full Level 2 or Level 3 qualification may be eligible for free tuition, subject to status and depending on the course.

If you are not eligible for free tuition full fees are payable. Where fees are due, an Advanced Learner Loan can help cover part or all of your course fees and provide financial support while you study.

You can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan if you are:

- > Aged 19 or over
- > A UK resident
- > Accepted on to an eligible course at Level 3

The minimum you can borrow is £300 and the maximum depends on the fees for your course. Once your offer has been confirmed and you have received our learning and funding information letter, you can register and apply for a loan online. You need to have an approved Advanced Learner Loan in place before you enrol. If you don't, you will need to discuss your options with us at enrolment.

You do not need to pay your loan back until:

- > You have finished your course
- > You earn more than £25,000 per annum

Loan repayment is at a low rate and on a 30 year term, making it more manageable for you. Plus, if you get a loan to cover tuition fees for an Access to HE course and go on to study a degree, your loan will be written off. Bursaries may be available.

Instalment plan

If you choose not to take out an approved Advanced Learner Loan, or the qualification is not eligible for other public funding, you may be able to pay using an instalment plan. The minimum course fee eligible for instalments is £100.

You will pay 25% of your course fees at enrolment and the remainder will be spread between one and six months, depending on your requirements and the length of your chosen course.

All fees must be paid in full one month before the end of the course. Full details of the college's fees policy are available at our website.

Financial support

Don't let money worries hold you back; we can help you overcome financial barriers and succeed on your chosen course.

You may be eligible for help with travel, meals and childcare costs. We can also help you with course-related costs such as specific equipment, protective clothing, specialist books and educational visits.

Digital Functional Skills

Entry Level

Duration: 14 weeks

Location: Harrogate College or Ripon Community House **Study:** One day a week

Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this entry level course.

Progression

Students can embark on higher level courses, or build on their knowledge and skills further with the Digital Functional Skills Level 1 course.



Level 1

Price: £462 (funding available*)

Duration: 14 weeks

Location: Harrogate College or Ripon Community House **Study:** One day a week

Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this course, however, you may find it an advantage if you have completed the Digital Functional Skills Entry Level course.

Progression

Students can progress to higher level digital courses, or with the transferable skills gained in this course pursue further study in an unrelated field, or enter employment.

English and Maths

GCSE English Language

Level: 2 | Price: Free*
Start date: September
Duration: 1 year

Location: Harrogate College or Ripon Community House **Study:** Part-time. Evening and daytime study is available

Entry Requirements

A minimum of Functional Skills English Language at Level 1 or equivalent.

Progression

GCSE English is required for most jobs or further study. This qualification, alongside GCSE Maths, will open up many possibilities from employment to Level 3 qualifications or apprenticeships.

GCSE Maths

Level: 2 | Price: Free*
Start date: September
Duration: 1 year

Location: Harrogate College or Ripon Community House **Study:** Part-time. Evening and daytime study is available

Entry Requirements

Learners will complete a short assessment.

Progression

GCSE Maths will open up possibilities from employment to further study.



Bookkeeping, AAT

Level: 1 | Price: Free* or £835

Duration: 12 weeks

Location: Harrogate College or Ripon Community House

Study: Part-time

Entry Requirements

There is no need for any prior accounting or bookkeeping knowledge.

Progression

This course is designed to support individuals who would like to progress into jobs as a cashier, clerical assistant or trainee bookkeeping assistant. Please note that should you wish to pursue further study, you will need a Level 2 or equivalent qualification in English.

Business Skills, AAT

Entry Requirements

No formal qualifications are required.

Progression

This course is designed to support individuals who would like to progress into jobs as a data entry clerk, administrative assistant, receptionist, retail assistant, customer service advisor, dispatch clerk or warehouse operative.

The core knowledge and skills gained prepare students for employment or further study.

Accounting AAT

Entry Requirements

Candidates must have a minimum of two GCSEs at grade 4 (previous grade C) or above in English and maths, or a Level 2 in English.

Progression

Progression may include an advanced or professional accounting diploma.

Level 3

Price: Free* or £2.573 **Duration:** 1 year Location: Online **Study:** Part-time

Entry Requirements

To be eligible for this course, you must already have a good understanding of the double-entry bookkeeping system. We also ask that you already hold a Functional Skills Level 2 qualification, or GCSEs in English language and maths at grade 3 or above.

Progression

On completion of this qualification you can apply for membership to become a professional bookkeeper. Progression may also include an AAT Accounting Professional Diploma Level 4.

Level 4







Progression

Upon successful completion of this Level 1 course, students can progress to our Level 2 course, or onto further study in a relevant subject.



Skills Bootcamps

Our Skills Bootcamps are six-week courses that provide practical, applicable workplace skills. With no formal entry requirements, and funding available (subject to eligibility) these bootcamps are an excellent way of developing knowledge, skills and confidence. Previous bootcamps have included Progression into Care, and Social Media Marketing.

The Progression into Care course ran in collaboration with Harrogate Teaching Hospitals NHS and saw two students gain employment following the interviews held at the end of the course.

Our Social Media Marketing bootcamp was a popular course that 100% of the students said would recommend to a friend. The interactive course gave practical advice and participants were able to tailor the advice to their situation.
